

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered child-centred practice and care, within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 16 August 2021 and 1 September 2021, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 27 September 2021, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had improved the procedures for ensuring children are adequately supervised when transitioning between the indoor and outside play areas. The provider had ensured accident records are accurate and contain sufficient detail. The provider had ensured medication record are now accurately maintained.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
