Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder's home is welcoming, clean and well organised. She understands the importance of developing secure relationships with children, to help them feel safe and secure.
- The childminder values strong partnerships with parents. She discusses how she will share information with parents, to help promote consistency in children's care routines and learning.
- The childminder recognises her duty to safeguard children and protect them from harm. She completes regular training and understands a wide range of safeguarding issues. The childminder knows how to identify possible signs of abuse and who to contact should she have concerns about children's welfare.
- The childminder understands how children learn and develop. She describes how she will support their progress through the early years foundation stage with a broad curriculum. The childminder has a good range of toys and educational resources for children of different ages and abilities.
- The childminder knows it is important to help prepare children for school. She explains how she will support children to be independent and manage their personal care and hygiene.
- The childminder understands how to positively manage children's behaviour. She describes how she will teach them social skills, such as how to share and be kind to each other.
- The childminder discusses how she will support children's understanding of healthy lifestyles. She knows how to provide healthy meals and snacks for children and how to cater for any food allergies.
- The childminder recognises the significance of providing an inclusive service. She knows how to support children's positive awareness of people different from themselves and the wider community.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The childminder described how she will organise her provision, including the learning programmes for children.
- The inspector reviewed a range of documents, including the childminder's paediatric first-aid certificate and safeguarding policies.
