## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the need to reflect on the quality of her practice to help identify areas for further development. She keeps up to date with the latest changes to meet requirements.
- The childminder has completed appropriate first-aid training since the last inspection. This helped her to update her knowledge of how to correctly respond to children in emergency situations.
- The childminder explains how she plans a broad curriculum and uses her observations and assessments of children to identify what they need to learn next. She knows how to help children progress to the next stage in learning and the move to school.
- The childminder understands the benefit to work in partnership with parents and other professionals. She shares information with parents about their children's progress to support their development. This helps to provide consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of her role and responsibility to safeguard children. She understands the procedures to follow should she have a concern about children's welfare, to keep them safe.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health and well-being. For example, by providing healthy fruit snacks and enabling children to learn in the fresh air.
- The childminder demonstrates that she understands how to promote children's positive behaviour and how to teach children about differences between them and the wider world.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
