

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 26 January 2022, the provider notified Ofsted of a significant event. The notification was not received within the 14 days after the event occurred. On 31 January 2022, we made a regulatory telephone call to the provider. Following a discussion, it was deemed that the provider had a reasonable excuse and therefore had not committed an offence of not notifying Ofsted of a significant event within the 14 days. During the

telephone call, we found that the provider had begun an internal investigation. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
