## Summary of key findings

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of child protection procedures. She talks about her duty to keep children safe and how she will do this. The childminder knows where to report any concerns she may have about children's safety. She has recently updated her safeguarding knowledge to improve her understanding.
- The childminder recognises the significance of carrying out risk assessments. Through discussion, she demonstrates how she will maintain a safe and secure environment for all children. She ensures her paediatric first-aid qualification is valid at all times, and her public liability insurance is renewed annually.
- The childminder describes how she will promote children's physical development and the importance of living a healthy lifestyle. The childminder intends to provide plenty of opportunities for children to play outside and support their growing independence.
- The childminder describes how she will find out what children already know and can do when they first start. She shares how she will work alongside parents to gather this information. The childminder explains how she will use this information to plan the next steps in children's learning.
- The childminder describes how she will support children to develop positive attitudes towards each other. She explains how she will help children to develop skills, such as sharing and taking turns as they play.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of all areas of the early years curriculum. She discusses the activities and resources she will provide for children, both indoors and outdoors, to support them to make good progress across all areas of learning. She explains that these will be easily accessible and age-appropriate to encourage children to investigate and explore.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will include parents and other professional agencies in children's learning and development.
