Information about this children's home

This privately owned children's home provides care and accommodation for up to two children who have complex needs. The manager has been registered with Ofsted since April 2021.

Inspection date: 21 December 2021

This monitoring visit

This children's home was judged as inadequate at a full inspection on 6 and 7 December 2021. The provider was issued with one compliance notice under regulation 20 due to serious concerns in relation to physical intervention training and practice. A notice to restrict accommodation was also issued.

The purpose of this monitoring visit was to review the provider's actions taken to meet the compliance notice.

One child lives at the home, although he was staying with his parent at the time of the monitoring visit.

The registered manager is not at work at this time. Despite attempts made by the director and inspectors, the responsible individual remained uncontactable during the inspection. It is unclear who is in day-to-day charge of the home in the manager's absence.

There are not enough staff to safely care for the child. On occasions new staff have been left alone to care for the child, which was not a well-considered and safe arrangement. Only one permanent member of staff is currently available to work at the home. Insufficient staff leaves the child vulnerable to the risk of harm.

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The inspectors had advised the provider that they would need to demonstrate how they had met all the steps in the compliance notice during the visit. However, they were not able to do so.

The requirements raised at the full inspection remain in place.

A suspension notice was served on the day of the visit.

The registered person must ensure that a record is made of any complaint, the action taken in response, and the outcome of any investigation.	30 January 2022
The registered person must ensure that no child is subject to any reprisal for making a complaint or representation. (Regulation 39 (3) (4))
