Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Appropriate checks to determine the suitability of all adults living or working on the premises are completed. This includes the childminder's assistant who occasionally works alongside her.
- The childminder provides premises that are safe and suitable for childminding. Through discussion and during a tour of the premises, the childminder demonstrates how she minimises potential hazards.
- The childminder demonstrates she has met the actions raised at her last Ofsted inspection. The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other providers. She describes the benefits to children's care and learning through working together.
- The childminder is aware of what she must do in the event of a concern about a child in her care. She describes her local referral procedures and what she must do if an allegation is made against her or any person living or working on her premises. The childminder supports her assistant to understand their responsibilities and she monitors her practice.
- The childminder is currently reviewing and updating her knowledge in relation to changes in legislation and guidance. She is aware of the introduction of teaching children about good oral health. The childminder understands the seven areas of learning and is able to describe how she will implement opportunities for children to progress in their development.
- The childminder explains she gathers information from children's parents about their current stage of development on entry. She explains that she also keeps parents informed of their children's achievements and any gaps that she identifies in their learning.
- The childminder attends training to keep her knowledge current in first aid. Through discussion, she shares what she would do in the event of a serious accident involving a child in her care. The childminder also explains that she keeps records of accidents and the first-aid treatment she has given.
- The childminder demonstrates she is aware of all records, policies and procedures that are required for the safe and efficient management of her childminding provision. The childminder explains she records the children's attendance to show their times of arrival and departure.
- In discussion, the childminder describes suitable strategies for managing children's behaviour and helping children to learn right from wrong.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This is the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and promote children's progress when she resumes childminding.
- The inspector looked around the childminder's house and garden and assessed the suitability of the provision for childcare. This included the safety of the premises and the availability of equipment, toys and activities.
- The inspector looked at evidence of the childminder's training.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she will put her policies and procedures into practice.
- The inspector looked at records and documentation.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of all adults living or working on the premises.



We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
