Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder's understanding of some safeguarding issues is weak. This means that she does not know how to protect children appropriately. The childminder does not have sufficient understanding of broader safeguarding issues, particularly the 'Prevent' duty guidance and female genital mutilation.
- The childminder's home is safe and secure. She understands how to help to keep children safe from potential hazards indoors and on outings. The childminder holds a current paediatric first-aid certificate and public liability insurance, as required.
- The childminder understands how to encourage children to follow healthy lifestyles. For example, she discusses how she will provide children with nutritious meals and snacks. The childminder explains how she will promote children's physical activity and encourage them to spend time outdoors.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of the early years curriculum. Through discussion, she explains how she will use a a range of teaching skills to meet children's individual learning needs and interests. The childminder has systems in place to observe and monitor children's progress, and to swiftly identify any gaps in their learning.
- The childminder understands how to help support children's positive behaviour and confidence. She explains how she will help children to develop positive relationships, and to be kind and respectful to others. The childminder describes how she will build secure attachments with children to develop their emotional well-being and independence.
- The childminder has a positive attitude. She aims to make the necessary changes to develop her knowledge and skills, and to meet requirements.
- The childminder recognises the value of working closely with parents and other professionals to help promote continuity of care and learning for children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
