Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has clear intent for her curriculum for children. She explains how she encourages children's sense of well-being through activities, such as yoga and breathing exercises.
- The childminder recognises the significant impact of the COVID-19 restrictions on children's personal, social and emotional development. Therefore, she plans regular trips to group activities to support children to experience group play and learning.
- Technology, such as instant messaging applications, are used by the childminder to share information with parents and carers. This enables the childminder to share her observations of children's learning and development with their parents. The childminder explains that she talks to parents when they collect children to encourage a two-way exchange of information to support children's progress.
- The childminder discusses how she supervises children as they play. She explains how she sometimes works with an assistant to ensure that there is always a suitable person caring for children.
- Through discussion, the childminder explains how she manages children's behaviour. She is aware of factors that can have an impact on children's behaviour, such as how much they sleep, having consistent support and medical conditions.
- Using photos and demonstrating with resources, the childminder explains how she supports children's understanding about diversity and differences between themselves and others.
- The childminder carries out risk assessments of her home and her car that she uses to transport children. She demonstrates an awareness of how to secure children in their car seats to ensure they travel safely.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure understanding about how to identify the signs and symptoms that children might be at risk of harm. She knows how to refer any such concerns to the local safeguarding children partnerships. The childminder and her assistant update their knowledge through undertaking regular training.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector talked to the childminder and her assistant at suitable times throughout the inspection.
- The inspector read through written feedback left by parents and took account of their views.
