## Summary of key findings

### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not keep her knowledge up to date to meet statutory requirements. She is unaware of the correct procedures to follow in line with the local safeguarding partnership, should she have a concern about a child, to protect their welfare.
- The childminder does not maintain her public liability insurance. She does not have documents readily available for inspection. In addition, the childminder does not keep a written record of complaints and their outcomes as required.
- The childminder knows how to support her assistant to help them deliver a good quality education to children.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to help deliver continuity in children's care and learning.
- The childminder knows how to observe, assess and plan for children's learning to help them to make progress and prepare them for school.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children how to lead healthy lifestyles. For example, she describes how she would provide children with regular access to fresh air, and a healthy and balanced diet.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's positive behaviour. She explains how she will teach children how to share and care for one another. The childminder knows how to encourage children's awareness of similarities and differences, and prepare them for life in modern Britain.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### What does the setting need to do to improve?

#### To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
