Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She knows how to identify the signs of possible harm to a child and knows how to report any concerns about a child in her care to the appropriate agencies. She knows how to reduce risks, and the need for emergency evacuation arrangements.
- The childminder knows the requirements and the documents and records that she needs to support the running of the childminding setting.
- The childminder understands how to support children well in all areas of learning. She understands how to help children of different backgrounds, abilities and ages to be ready for their next stage in learning, including school.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents, outside professionals and other early years providers, to help ensure continuity and progression in children's learning and development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting children's personal development and behaviour and attitudes, so they learn to behave well and respect others.
- The childminder understands the need to maintain her professional development to support children's development. This has included training to complete an early years educator qualification. She understands the importance of evaluating her provision regularly to drive improvement.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities
