# **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to provide a broad range of enjoyable activities to help promote children's ongoing development. She understands how to use her garden for children to explore the world around them and develop a range of physical skills. She makes sure children have a good selection of resources to choose from. The childminder is committed to creating an environment where children flourish, feel safe, and are happy.
- The childminder is fully aware of her responsibilities to ensure all children are safe. She discusses actions she would take if she had a concern about a child's welfare. She has a clear understanding of how to safeguard children, and how to seek advice and support.
- The childminder has high expectations regarding children's behaviour. She knows how to manage their behaviour in a supportive way and build sharing, turn taking and an understanding of others into daily activities. She understands the benefit of giving children opportunities to talk about their experiences.
- Children are offered a healthy, balanced variety of meals and snacks, including risotto, curry, sausages, and a variety of vegetables. The childminder understands the importance of good table manners and ensures children are able to use cutlery.
- The childminder recognises the importance of building good relationships and working partnerships with schools and parents. This helps her to develop consistent approaches for children. Children then know what is expected from them and how to behave appropriately.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her practice to identify ways of improving children's experiences. She understands the need to share children's achievements and support the emotional well-being of the children in her care.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of the curriculum and plans exciting activities to complement children's experiences. She understands how to talk to children about what they are learning at school and any current interests.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.

- The inspector held a discussion with the childminder to understand how the provision is organised.
