Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn and develop. She explains how she will use children's prior knowledge and interests to help her to plan learning opportunities.
- The childminder understands the importance of sharing books and reading stories regularly with children. She explains how this will help children to develop a love of reading.
- The childminder explains how she will encourage children to be independent. For example, she describes how she will support children to learn how to put on their coat and shoes, and how to use a knife and fork.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting children to manage their feelings and behaviour. She explains how she will encourage them to share, take turns and talk about their emotions.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates that she recognises the importance of seeking children's views. She explains how she will engage them in planning activities. For example, the childminder will involve children in deciding what to cook and visiting the local shop to buy the ingredients.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of the importance of strong partnerships with parents. She explains how this will support children's development and well-being.
- The childminder provides a safe environment. She understands the need to assess risks. For example, the childminder explains how she will check the outdoor area for safety before children play outside. She describes how she will organise the environment to meet the needs of children. For example, the childminder will offer children a broad range of accessible resources to choose from.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities to ensure that all children are safe. She knows the actions she must take if she has a concern about a child's welfare or safety. The childminder has a secure knowledge of broader safeguarding issues, such as grooming and online safety.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice to help her improve. She describes how she will seek the opinions of parents and children to help her reflect on her practice. The childminder keeps her knowledge up to date through online training.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
