Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a firm understanding of her safeguarding responsibilities. She completes regular training to keep her knowledge up to date. The childminder knows the process to follow, should she need to raise concerns regarding children's welfare. She has clear policies in place to keep children safe.
- The childminder intends to share her policies and procedures with parents. She recognises the importance of helping children to understand about keeping themselves safe. For instance, the childminder discusses how to she will encourage children to use electronic devices safely and keep their mobile phones safely stored away while in her home. The childminder understands how to provide a safe environment for children.
- The childminder has clear plans to provide a wide and varied range of learning experiences for children in her home and the wider community. She understands the importance of observing and assessing children's learning to monitor their progress. The childminder intends to provide parents with regular updates on how their children are progressing. She will involve parents in identifying what their children need to learn next and how to plan for their ongoing progress.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's positive behaviour, and to help them to develop respect for themselves and others. She recognises the importance of enabling children to develop their confidence and independence. The childminder explains how she intends to encourage children to make choices for themselves and to learn essential skills, such as choosing activities.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's physical health, and help them to develop and enjoy healthy lifestyles. For example, she will encourage children to wash their hands regularly, and provide them with healthy and nutritious meals. The childminder has a current first-aid certificate.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her practice and is committed to improving and updating her childcare knowledge. She completes training, and carries out reading and research to keep up to date about changes to early years guidance, and to develop her professional skills and knowledge.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
