

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 20 January 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 21 February 2022 and 21 March 2022 we carried out regulatory telephone calls and on 23 March 2022 we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the calls and the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions and learning and development actions, raised at their last inspection. We found the provider had met some of the safeguarding and welfare actions but not others. For example, they had attended updated child protection training and had improved their understanding of local safeguarding partnership arrangements. They had found out information about other settings that children attend to promote effective information sharing. However, they had not yet provided all required information relevant to their registration to Ofsted.

Additionally, during the regulatory visit on 23 March 2022 we found new areas of concern. This means that the provider was not meeting other requirements as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. In relation to the new areas of concern we have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Action required by 21 April 2022

- ensure that you supply a copy of your recent inspection report to parents and/or carers of children attending on a regular basis
- make sure that you supervise children adequately in your care, to meet the needs of all children and ensure their safety



■ take all reasonable steps to ensure that children in your care are not exposed to risks, how you will check areas used by children on a regular basis, and how risks will be removed or minimised.
