Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider understands her role in keeping children safe and protecting them from risk of harm. She ensures that staff attend regular training to help them to recognise when a child may be at risk. Staff demonstrate a good understanding of how to spot the signs of abuse, including wider safeguarding issues. The provider and staff are confident on the procedures to follow if they are concerned about the well-being of a child.
- The provider acknowledges the importance of following robust recruitment practices, to ensure the suitability of all adults working with children. She recognises the need to update checks to ensure staffs' ongoing suitability.
- The provider understands her role in keeping the environment safe. For instance, supervising children and completing regular checks to help identify and eliminate any potential risks.
- The provider understands her role in supporting children to lead a healthy lifestyle. For instance, encouraging them to make healthy food choices and ensure they benefit from regular fresh air and exercise.
- The provider recognises the value of working in partnerships with parents and other professionals involved in children's care, ensuring children receive consistent support.
- The provider understands the importance of seeking the views of others, including parents and staff, to help evaluate the provision and identify areas for improvement. She is committed to ensuring that staff keep their knowledge and skills up to date to help guide and improve their practice. For example, through regular training and supervision.
- The provider recognises her role in teaching children to respect and value others. She understands the importance of setting clear boundaries to help guide children's behaviour.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities
