

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 24 March 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 4 My 2022 we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions and learning and development actions, raised at their last inspection. We found the provider had met some of the safeguarding and welfare actions but not others. For example, they improved the safety of the premises and all staff were using updated risk assessment procedures to ensure all areas are suitable for children's use. Induction procedures had been improved and new staff recruited were undertaking some appropriate training to equip them for their roles.

While staff had completed some updated child protection training this had not had the full impact. For example, staff were still unsure about some broader aspects of child protection such as how to respond to signs of potential radicalisation. Staff had not yet attended updated training in management of behaviour. The manager was working with outside support services to improve how staff manage children's behaviour consistently but had not had not fully implemented planned new procedures.

We will continue to review the action taken by the provider to meet the requirements.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
