

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 30 March 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 6 May 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of notifying Ofsted of any new household members either living or working at the childminding premises. The provider understands that if they should employ an assistant in the future that they need to complete the required suitability checks and hold a current first-aid certificate should they have sole charge of any minded children. In addition, the provider had implemented risk assessments to minimise potential dangers to children. They have reviewed and made changes to the arrangements for school runs and visits to the park to promote children's safety. The provider has also improved record keeping in relation to children's accidents and injuries and how this information is shared with parents.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
