Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder's home is suitable for children's care. She offers a broad range of resources to support children's learning and development.
- The childminder understands how to recognise signs that children may be at risk of harm or extremist behaviour. She knows the local area procedures to follow if she has any concerns. The childminder undertakes regular training to help her keep her knowledge and understanding of child protection matters up to date.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents. She explains that she will talk to parents to provide regular feedback about children's progress and care.
- The childminder is aware of the need to evaluate her practice, develop her skills and keep her knowledge up to date.
- The childminder knows how to support children's physical and emotional well-being. For example, she understands children benefit from feeling welcome in her home and opportunities to play in the fresh air.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She demonstrates, through discussion, how she intends to plan activities that interest and motivate children and will support their learning.
- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's progress. She describes how she will use children's interests to plan activities and promote the next steps in their learning. The childminder describes the broad range of techniques she will use to encourage children to talk and express themselves.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
