

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 28 April 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 11 May 2022. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 6 June 2022:

- be alert to any issues of concern in a child's life at home or elsewhere in order liaise with other professionals and raise any safeguarding concerns swiftly
- ensure that the named lead practitioner for safeguarding attends appropriate training to enable them to fully understand their role and take responsibility for safeguarding children
- ensure the provider and all staff have a thorough understanding of the safeguarding policy and procedures
- make certain that the provider and all staff have an up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding issues, including 'Prevent' Duty guidance
- undertake suitable professional development opportunities to ensure that requirements are met and the provision for children continually improves
- put in place appropriate arrangements for the supervision of staff who have contact with children to promote effective support and training to foster continuous improvement
- ensure that a valid paediatric first-aid certificate is in place, which meets the criteria set out in Annex A of the statutory framework for the early years foundation stage



- provide evidence of adequate insurance for any vehicle used to transport children
- ensure records are easily accessible and available for inspection purposes

On 31 May 2022, we found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of and now fully understands their responsibilities.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
