

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 15 March 2022, we carried out an inspection. We found that although the provider had met the actions set out in the welfare requirements notice which was served on 28 February 2022, they were not meeting other requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 28 March 2022, we served another welfare requirements notice and on 5 May 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. We found that the provider had taken steps to reflect on the quality of practice and make the improvements previously required. They had reorganised the use of space and groups of children to help to; improve staff deployment, provide a consistent key person system, and to better meet children's individual developmental needs. They had worked with staff to improve strategies for managing behaviour and they had ensured that those children who needed help regulating their behaviour, were supported in different ways. The provider had also taken steps to remove potential risks and was working with staff to raise their awareness of minimising risk.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. We will monitor action taken to improve learning and development at the next inspection. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
