Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of her roles and responsibilities in relation to keeping children safe. She knows the process to follow if she needs to raise concerns and has robust policies and procedures in place. The childminder is aware of risks in the home. She describes how she will keep children safe while out on visits to the park.
- The childminder confidently explains how she plans to support children's learning and development. She has a range of age-appropriate resources available, which are considered to meet the needs of the children. She talks about how to track and monitor the children and plan suitable activities to extend their learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of obtaining information about the child before they start, for example about the child's interests and abilities. This will enable her to effectively support the child's learning and developmental needs. She offers settling-in sessions before the child starts to ensure a smooth transition into her care. She talks about the importance of sharing information with the parents about their child's progress and development.
- The childminder shows an understanding of the needs of different ages of children and wants to provide an environment that all children are happy in. She talks about providing a 'chill out' area for older children to use when they come back from school. She talks about the importance of supporting children to manage their emotional development and interact positively with each other.
- The childminder is aware of how to identify children if they require additional support, for example those who speak English as an additional language (EAL). She plans to work closely with the parents and gather key words in the children's home languages to support their communication. The childminder is aware of the importance for children who speak EAL to join in and make relationships with other children in the setting.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities
