

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 May 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate.

Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirement notice on 26 May 2022. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 1 June 2022:

- provide Ofsted with the necessary information to enable checks to be completed to establish the suitability of anyone who works on the premises
- improve knowledge and understanding of safeguarding matters
- keep a written record when medication is administered
- keep a daily record of the hours of children's attendance.

On 10 June 2022, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. The focus of the call was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. The provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of child protection procedures and now fully understands their responsibilities. The necessary information needed to carry out suitability checks has now been shared with Ofsted. The provider now has more secure systems in place with regards to the administration of medication and the record of children's attendance.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The

provider is still registered with Ofsted.
