## Information about this children's home

A private provider owns and manages this home. The home provides care for up to five children who may have emotional and/or social difficulties.

There is currently no registered manager at this home.

## This monitoring visit

This visit was to monitor the provider's compliance with meeting the steps that were identified in a compliance notice that was issued under regulation 13, following the monitoring visit on 14 February 2022. That monitoring visit was in response to information that had been shared with Ofsted that indicated a potential risk of harm to children.

Following the monitoring visit on 14 February 2022, the provider chose to temporarily close the home. Ofsted issued a notice of proposal to impose a condition whereby the provider must give Ofsted three months' notice of its intention to admit any child into the home.

At this monitoring visit, the inspector confirms that there are no children living in the home and has reissued the compliance notice under regulation 13. The eight further requirements and the two recommendations made following the visit in February 2022 have also been reissued.

The provider confirmed plans to refurbish the home and reopen. The provider has taken steps to recruit a manager and once they are in post they will recruit staff.

The registered person must—	
maintain in the home the records in Schedule 4. (Regulation 37 (1) (2)(a))	
This requirement was made at the last inspection and is restated.	
The registered person must ensure that a record is made of any complaint, the action taken in response, and the outcome of any investigation.	31 July 2022
The registered person must ensure that no child is subject to any reprisal for making a complaint or representation. (Regulation 39 (3) (4))	
This requirement was made at the last inspection and is restated.	



The registered person must notify HMCI and each other relevant person without delay if—	31 July 2022
a child is involved in or subject to, or is suspected of being involved in or subject to, sexual exploitation;	
an incident requiring police involvement occurs in relation to a child which the registered person considers to be serious;	
there is an allegation of abuse against the home or a person working there;	
there is any other incident relating to a child which the registered person considers to be serious. (Regulation 40 (4)(a)(b)(c)(e))	
This requirement was made at the last inspection and is restated.

### Recommendations

- The registered person should ensure that there is a nurturing and supportive environment that meet the needs of the children. Children's homes must comply with relevant health and safety legislations (alarms, food hygiene etc.). Rooms and outside areas need to be decorated and maintained to ensure that the home remains warm and welcoming and is not institutionalised. ('Guide to the Children's Homes Regulations, including the quality standards', page 15, paragraph 3.9)
- The registered person should ensure that staff are familiar with the home's policies on record-keeping and understand the importance of careful, objective and clear recording. Staff should record information on individual children in a non-stigmatising way that distinguishes between fact, opinion and third-party information. Information about the child must always be recorded in a way that will be helpful to the child. ('Guide to the Children's Homes Regulations, including the quality standards', page 62, paragraph 14.4)
