Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates how she will track children's development across all areas of learning. She demonstrates an understanding of how to create exciting learning opportunities for children, both indoors and outdoors, to support children to make good progress across all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of a healthy lifestyle. She demonstrates how she will provide healthy and nutritious meals and snacks for children. The childminder intends to provide plenty of opportunities for children to play outside and take manageable risks in their play.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to promote children's emotional attachments and positive relationships. She has good knowledge of behaviour management, and discusses the strategies she will put in place to encourage children to be tolerant and respectful to others. She understands the importance of an inclusive setting.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents. She plans to share information about children's progress with their parents, and help them to support their children's learning at home.
- The childminder knows the procedures to follow should she have any concerns about a child in her care. She has a good understanding of her responsibilities to safeguard children, and can identify possible signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect. She demonstrates how she will maintain a safe and secure environment for children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The childminder provided the inspector with a sample of key documentation on request, including evidence of her suitability and the suitability of household members.
