Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has robust procedures in place to keep children safe in her care. She completes comprehensive risk assessments of all areas of her setting as well as for trips out. The childminder has a wide range of age-appropriate resources to meet the needs of all children.
- The childminder has a strong understanding of her role in safeguarding children. She has clear knowledge of the signs and symptoms that could indicate a child is at risk of harm.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. She explains clearly how she shares information about children's daily routines. She understands the importance of sharing developmental information with parents and how this enables them to support children's progress at home.
- The childminder understands the need to create a stimulating environment for all children. She has a wide range of resources, which she adapts to meet the varied needs and interests of the children she cares for.
- The childminder explains how she monitors children's development. She understands the importance of vital assessments in supporting children's learning. The childminder discusses how she uses her findings to plan activities to further support children's development.
- The childminder has a consistent approach to behaviour management. She explains how she offers positive reinforcement and encourages children to understand the impact their behaviour has on others.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting children's understanding of healthy lifestyles. She provides healthy meals and snacks and encourages children to be active with access to outdoor play. The childminder talks about the importance of essential hygiene procedures, such as regular handwashing.
- The childminder explains the need to establish close bonds with all children. She understands the role this plays in helping children feel secure and settle swiftly in her care.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities
