

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 20 May 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 13 June 2022 we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. We found that the provider had taken steps to ensure everyone had updated safeguarding knowledge in line with local procedures. This includes steps to take if there is an allegation. The provider now ensures there is a robust recruitment procedure in place to assess staff suitability. This includes a thorough and up-to-date induction with ongoing support. The provider has taken steps to staff fully understand their roles and responsibilities. The provider has acted to ensure that children's needs are met securely and consistently. There is a rigorous system for deployment of staff to ensure children are supported and supervised. Children's behaviour is now supported in an appropriate way so that children understand the behavioural expectations. Children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) now receive the right level of support so they are not adversely disadvantaged.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted
