

Complaint about childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 7 July 2022, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. On 7 July 2022, the provider notified us that there had been a recent incident where a child had left the premises unsupervised. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of any significant event.

On 11 July 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider had improved risk assessment. Staff were reminded that all external doors must be locked when anyone leaves the building. The security of all inner doors has been checked and any necessary repairs completed.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
