

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 27 May 2022 and 7 June and 15 June 2022, the provider notified us of some significant safeguarding events. These notifications means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of any events or serious injuries to a child.

On 17 June 2022 we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Actions needed by 1 July 2022:

- ensure that accidents are dealt with appropriately and that the necessary action is taken to make sure children receive hospital treatment promptly
- ensure that all staff and managers are fully aware of their roles and responsibilities to report any inappropriate behaviour or practice by other members of staff to the designated safeguarding leads
- improve the deployment of staff to ensure that children are supervised at all times
- ensure that you have a robust understanding of your roles and responsibilities to meet the requirements of the early year's foundation stage.

On 1 July 2022 the provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider had ensured staff and managers understand their responsibilities, they reviewed staffing to ensure children are supervised at all times and reviewed policy and procedures relating to safeguarding and dealing with any accidents.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The



provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
