Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders understand their role in keeping children safe and protecting them from risk of harm. They ensure that staff have regular training to help them identify the signs of abuse. Staff demonstrate a good understanding of the signs that a child may be at risk of harm. This includes the broader aspects of safeguarding, such as the 'Prevent' duty. The premises are secure and staff carry out effective risk assessments.
- Leaders describe the importance of ensuring that robust recruitment procedures are in place, including how they check the ongoing suitability of staff. They recognise their responsibility to make sure that staff have adequate qualifications, training, skills and a clear understanding of their roles and responsibilities.
- Leaders acknowledge the importance of building strong partnerships with parents, professionals and other settings that children attend. This helps to provide a consistent approach to meeting children's needs and helps them to feel safe and secure.
- Leaders explain how promoting children's healthy lifestyles are important in the club. For instance, they encourage children to make healthy food choices and ensure they benefit from regular fresh air and exercise. Leaders describe how these activities help children to develop a range of physical skills and builds confidence.
- Children's individual needs are considered well. Staff describe how they will support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. They comment on the adaptations they will make to help all children feel part of the activities and experiences they offer at the club.
- Staff describe how they are attentive and responsive to children. They explain how they model respect and positive language, to encourage children's good behaviour. Staff recognise their role in teaching children to respect and value others.
- Leaders are highly reflective of the service they offer. They seek the views of children, staff and parents. This informs continuous improvement, so that children are given the very best opportunities and experiences.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the setting received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the setting and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the setting.
- The inspector viewed the provision, and discussed the safety and suitability of the premises.
- Managers showed the inspector key documentation, including information to demonstrate the suitability of staff.
- The inspector spoke with managers about the leadership and management of the setting.
- Although there were no children in the early age range present at the time of this inspection, there were children present who were over the age of five years.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
