Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her service and strive for improvements to benefit children. She has completed paediatric first-aid training since the last inspection and knows how to respond to children in emergency situations.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of safeguarding. For example, she knows how to identify and report any concerns regarding children's welfare. The childminder understands the risks children may be exposed to online.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour positively, including through conversations about respecting each other's differences.
- The childminder understands how to plan for children's learning, considering their unique abilities and different ages, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities and those who speak English as an additional language. She knows how to provide a wide range of opportunities to build on their listening and attention, vocabulary and communication and language skills.
- The childminder knows how to help children learn about healthy lifestyles. She plans to provide regular opportunities for children to be active outdoors, including in parks and playgrounds.
- The childminder understands the benefit of working in partnership with parents, carers and other professionals involved in children's development. She wants to ensure consistency in children's learning and development to help children achieve their best potential.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
