

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills is leading Ofsted's work into how regulated early years and childcare providers in England have delivered child-centred practice and care, within the context of the restrictions placed on society during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.

'All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early year's foundation stage', which you can find at <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework> If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 17th June 2022, the provider notified us of a significant event. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage.

On 22nd July 2022, we reviewed the investigation and carried out a telephone regulatory event to discuss the notification and the outcome of their investigation. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken prompt action to put this right. The provider has reviewed procedures for supervising the children when they move between rooms in the nursery. All staff have received on head counts and risk assessments to help ensure children's safety when moving around the nursery.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply

with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
