Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The experienced owner, manager and deputy work extremely well together to support and monitor staff performance at all levels. They have a secure understanding of how to provide a varied range of experiences for children's enjoyment and to build on what they learn at school.
- The management team place a high priority on safeguarding children. There are effective systems in place to ensure children arrive safely to the club and the environment and activities are suitable and safe for children. Staff know about the possible signs of the abuse and the procedure to follow if they have a concern about a child.
- The management team recognise the value of obtaining the views of parents, children and staff to help them evaluate what they provide and further develop the service on offer. The programme of activities they offer includes a variety of activities and experiences, which are tailored for children's interests.
- Working in partnership with staff at the on-site school is a key priority to ensure the sharing of information about children's care and well-being. There are clear procedures in place for staff to follow to ensure information is shared between the club, school staff and parents to support children's welfare.
- The management team and staff team are knowledgeable about how to provide an inclusive environment for all children. The programme of activities provides plenty of opportunities for staff to teach children about their differences and communities beyond their own experience.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Of these, two hold an appropriate early years qualification at level 3 and one holds a qualification at level 2. The club opens from Monday to Friday, term time only. Sessions are from 7.30am until 8.50am and from 3pm until 6pm.

Inspection activities

- This is the first inspection the club received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the manager and has taken that into account in the evaluation of the club.
- The inspector and the deputy manager completed a learning walk together to check the safety of the premises and to gather information about the experiences provided.
- The inspector held a meeting with the owner, manager and deputy manager. She looked at relevant documentation and evidence of the suitability of staff working in the club.
- Although there were no children in the early age range present at the time of this inspection, there were children present who were over the age of five years.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
