

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 23 May 2022, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. On 8 July 2022, we conducted a regulatory telephone call, where we found, the provider had failed to notify Ofsted of a significant event. This is a breach of the legal requirements. We do not intend to take any further action on this occasion. The provider is now aware of her responsibility to update Ofsted with any information that may impact on her registration. The provider since decided to change her registration to remove herself from the early years register and Childcare Register. She will remain on the voluntary part of the Childcare Register. Ofsted accepted this request and will amend the registration to reflect this.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
