

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 14 July 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served welfare requirements notice on 22 July 2022. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 4 August 2022:

- put in place appropriate arrangements for the supervision of staff to support, coach and train staff to enable them to develop their teaching skills and promote their well-being

- take immediate action to ensure all staff, including agency staff have a secure knowledge and understanding of the setting's safeguarding policy and procedures

- implement an effective key-person system to ensure children's emotional well-being is consistently promoted to meet their needs.

On 5 August 2022 we carried out a regulatory visit to check compliance with the welfare requirements notice. It was found that the provider had ensured that staff had completed safeguarding training, supervision processes had been improved and changes had been made to the key person system. This will be further monitored at the next inspection to ascertain whether improvement is sustained.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
