

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 30 June 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 27 July 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection. We found that the provider had not met one of the actions set in the welfare requirement notice. We have served another welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions by 11 August 2022.

ensure all staff have a secure knowledge and understanding of safeguarding policy and practice, including what constitutes an allegation; the procedure to follow if an allegation is and the role of the LADO.

On 15 August 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found that the provider had improved their knowledge and understanding of child protection procedures and the role of the LADO. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
