

## **Complaint about childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 6 July 2022, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

On 6 July 2022, the provider notified us of an incident. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted.

On 19 August 2022 we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. We found that the provider had improved their knowledge of maintaining ratios and ensuring staff are deployed so that children's needs are consistently met. The provider improved their understanding of ensuring that all staff are suitably vetted before being left alone with children.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
