Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider understands their duty to keep children safe and how to identify a child who may be at risk of abuse or neglect. They have a good understanding of safeguarding concerns, such as the 'Prevent' duty guidance and female genital mutilation. The provider is aware of where to report concerns and what to do if an allegation of abuse was made against a member of staff.
- The provider discussed the importance of teaching children about how to lead healthy lifestyles through having physical play outdoors and access to a healthy diet. The provider has considered the strategies they would use to support children's physical well-being and help them learn about the benefits of physical exercise.
- The provider understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and others involved in children's development to help provide continuity in children's care and learning.
- The provider has considered how they would deliver the curriculum by building on children's interests, what they know and what they can do. The provider has attended training to support their knowledge of assessment and how to plan appropriate activities for individual learning needs. The provider has appropriate resources to support children's learning and development.
- The provider understands the importance of developing safe and secure relationships with children to support their emotional well-being and promote a positive attitude to learning.
- The provider has the required records and information in place, such as having public liability insurance and an appropriate first-aid qualification.
- The provider understands how to support children with special educational needs and or/disabilities and those who speak English as an additional language. They also understand the importance of identifying gaps in children's learning and working with parents and other professionals to address these. The provider has considered what strategies they would use to ensure all children make progress.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
