The quality and standards of early years provision

Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- Managers do not fully understand their duty to keep children safe. The designated safeguarding lead has not ensured that other managers and staff understand the procedures to protect children from harm. In addition, procedures for managing allegations against staff and responding to all safeguarding issues are not securely understood. However, managers describe how they make sure premises are kept safe. This includes completing regular risk assessments.
- Managers do not ensure that staff induction and supervision procedures are fully effective. This includes making sure all staff have secure knowledge of child protection issues, including signs and symptoms of abuse.
- Managers describe how they plan to offer a fun, safe and inclusive environment for children. They intend to organise the activities to include indoor and outdoor learning based on different themes, such as the natural world and transport. They discuss how they intend to invite visitors from the local community, including the fire, police and lifeguard services. They explain how they want children to understand their wider community.
- Managers explain how they will help children to manage their behaviour, share and develop good relationships. They describe how they will buddy new children up with regular attendees to support their emotional well-being. The manager describes how they will help children to learn and follow the rules.
- Managers describe how they will promote a healthy diet and lifestyle. Ideas for healthy packed lunches will be shared in the welcome pack for parents. They explain how they will provide opportunities for sports and physically active games throughout the day. Managers describe how the games will support children's social skills as well as their physical skills.
- Managers explain how they support staff's continuing professional development. They use local authority and external training to build on existing knowledge.
- Managers describe how they intend to provide an inclusive service to the local community. They describe how they will work with parents of children with special educational needs and/or disabilities to ensure they can join in activities in a fun and safe environment.
- Managers recognise the importance of parent partnerships. They discuss plans to involve parents through surveys and discussions. Managers explain how they intend to evaluate the playscheme and the service they provide.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.



What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:

- The provider described the activities and experiences they intend to offer children
- The inspector spoke to the provider about how they will work in partnership with parents.
