# **Summary of key findings**

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of keeping children safe from harm. She knows how to correctly identify children who may be at risk of neglect and abuse. She successfully explains the correct procedures to take to report her concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of effectively managing children's behaviour. She confidently describes a range of strategies to help children of different ages to manage their own feelings and behaviour.
- The childminder shares how she will identify gaps in children's learning and development. She recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents. She explains clearly how she shares information about children's daily routines. She understands the importance of sharing developmental information with parents and how this enables them to support children's progress at home.
- The childminder explains the need to establish close bonds with all children. She understands the role this plays in helping children feel secure and settle swiftly in her care.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting children's understanding of healthy lifestyles. She provides healthy meals and snacks and encourages children to be active with access to outdoor play. The childminder talks about the importance of essential hygiene procedures, such as regular handwashing.
- The childminder describes how she values children's backgrounds and home experiences. For example, the childminder says she will gather information from parents about children's knowledge and experiences. She explains her plans to recognise important festivals and events and help children to understand different communities and cultures.
- The childminder explains what she intends children to learn and how she will plan a curriculum to build on what they know and can do. She explains how she will provide support for children of differing ages and abilities.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed areas of the premises used for childminding.
