

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at

www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 10 June 2022, we carried out an inspection and found that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be not met. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions set out in the inspection report. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

On 14 July 2022, we carried out an unannounced regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection. We found that the provider has improved her understanding of safer recruitment procedures. She is now aware of the requirement to allow Ofsted to complete the relevant suitability checks, and ensure that all people aged 16 or over who work with children or live on premises are suitable. She has also ensured that there are adequate and fully working toileting facilities available for children at all times.

However, we found that the provider had not met the other action in the welfare requirements notice. Required records and information were not available at all times. We served another welfare requirements notice. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 28 July 2022:

ensure that all records and information are available at all times.

On 1 September 2022, we carried out a further regulatory visit. We found that the provider has improved record keeping and now ensures that all required records and information are always available.

We are satisfied the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare action, raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
