Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders explain how they offer a safe, fun, inclusive environment. They discuss how they organise activities indoors and outdoors. Each week there are different themes, which incorporate children's ideas. These include 'Professor Bubbles' who teaches children about science and mathematics. They plan to teach children about the world around them with visits from animal companies. Children will also have opportunities for child-led play, this will support them to develop skills built on their interests.
- Teaching children about healthy practices will be embedded throughout the curriculum. The club offer a range of physical games and activities. They plan to use these to talk to children about healthy choices. They explain how they will encourage children's independence, supporting with developing toileting and hygiene skills. Children bring their own packed lunches. Leaders describe how they will support families to provide healthy meals by sharing information about healthy lifestyles.
- Leaders say they have good relationships with parents. They share information with them at the end of each day for older children that attend. This includes a daily card, which highlights their child's favourite activities. Leaders say they offer parents opportunities to give feedback through child and parent questionnaires. They plan to reflect on these to drive further improvement at the club.
- All staff at the club understand their safeguarding responsibilities. Reporting procedures are displayed for anyone with concerns. Leaders train all staff on what to do if there was an intruder or an emergency evacuation. They keep close links with the local authority. This will support them with keeping children safe and supporting any children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. Leaders describe how they work collaboratively, keeping up to date with events happening at the school and within the local community and incorporating these into the children's activities.
- Leaders understand the importance of continuing professional development. They send staff on regular training. This includes safeguarding, first aid and health and safety. Staff have regular access to a training platform. This supports them in developing their knowledge of how to meet the developmental needs of younger children.
- Leaders have a clear vision for the club. They are reflective and understand the club's strengths and any areas of development. They explain the importance of investing in their team, so that they can improve the service they offer for all children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
