Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- Despite taking effective steps to meet the actions set at the previous inspection, further breaches of legal requirements have been identified. These have a significant impact on children's safety and well-being. The childminder does not have secure knowledge about the safeguarding procedures within her local authority. Additionally, she does not know how to recognise or report a range of potential child protection indicators.
- The childminder has started working with her local authority improvement officer to undertake some required training. However, she has not identified the main areas of her practice that she needs to develop the most, in order to provide a safe and stimulating environment for children. Furthermore, the childminder has allowed her professional liability insurance to expire. She does not have effective systems in place to evaluate her setting and ensure she maintains a good level of care and safety for children.
- The childminder does not demonstrate a good understanding of how to effectively assess and remove potential risks to children, such as knives being stored at a low level in the kitchen. This puts children's safety at risk. Additionally, the childminder does not know how to respond effectively to a variety of accidents or incidents that may occur in the home. This compromises children's well-being.
- The childminder has not embedded procedures to follow in the event of an allegation being made against herself or anyone in the home. Additionally, she does not have a robust procedure in place to help advise parents on what to do if they wished to make a complaint.
- The childminder does not have secure knowledge about the safe administration of some types of medication. Her policy is not effective. This means children could receive medicine that may cause them to become unwell.
- The childminder has a weak knowledge of how to develop the areas of learning for children of different ages or stages in their development. She does not know how to effectively use her assessment to plan for children's next steps in learning. As a result, children do not experience a broad, rich and challenging curriculum, this hinders their progress.
- The childminder knows how to prepare and provide healthy home-cooked food for children. She knows how to safely prepare babies' milk and sterilise their feeding equipment. This helps to promote good health.
- The childminder knows how she intends to work with parents. She plans to update them regularly about their child's progress, and discuss any potential concerns for their development. This helps keep parents involved in their child's learning.



There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
