

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 13 May 2022, the provider notified us of a significant event relating to safeguarding. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of significant changes or events.

On 1 September 2022, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and we served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 9 September 2022:

- ensure the safeguarding policy and procedure is fully implemented in line with the guidance and procedures of the local safeguarding partners, particularly in the event of an allegation being made against a member of staff
- safeguard children more robustly by making referrals to the Disclosure and Barring Service where a member of staff is dismissed (or would have been, had the person not left the setting first) because they have harmed a child or put a child at risk of harm
- implement effective supervision arrangements for managers and those taking a lead for safeguarding so that any significant events and their outcomes are clearly communicated to the provider.

The provider subsequently took appropriate action with regard to all matters set out above. The provider is still registered with Ofsted

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our



responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
