

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 23 August 2022, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The overall effectiveness of the provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 23 September 2022, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider has implemented a clear child protection policy and procedure and has ensured that the lead practitioner for safeguarding has attended appropriate training and understands this. Recruitment procedures have been followed to check that staff working with children are suitable. Risk assessment has been improved to identify, remove or minimise risks to children's safety. The key person system and deployment of staff has been reviewed in order to meet the individual needs of children. Health and hygiene procedures have been improved to promote children's good health. A named special educational needs coordinator has been identified and the provider has sought appropriate training to help them understand their role and responsibilities and provide effective support for children who need it. There are now systems in place so that staff receive induction training and ongoing support, training and monitoring to help them fulfil their role and responsibilities.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted
