Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder keeps her safeguarding knowledge up to date. She has a secure awareness of how to safeguard children in her care. She understands the procedure to follow if she was concerned about a child's welfare. She describes possible signs that may indicate when a child may need protection, for instance, from abuse and exposure to extreme behaviours.
- The childminder understands the significance of evaluating her practice. She values feedback from parents and from the children. She understands the importance of maintaining effective partnerships with parents and other professionals. She demonstrates how partnership working supports children's learning and the progress they make. She is aware of her strengths and identifies some areas for improvement.
- The childminder explains how she helps children to develop positive relationships. For example, she teaches children about sharing, turn taking and respect for others through daily activities. The childminder understands the importance of developing secure attachments with children, to promote their confidence and emotional security.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates how she offers plenty of opportunities to play and learn outdoors. The childminder knows and understands the value of outdoor play to promote children's physical health and confidence.
- The childminder ensures her professional development is regularly updated. For example, she continues to complete relevant training to extend her skills and knowledge and enhance her teaching practice.
- The childminder is aware of how to monitor and observe children's learning. She explains how her observations inform planning and assessment. The childminder discusses how she uses assessment of children's progress to plan for the next stage in their learning.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
