### **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder provides engaging and welcoming play spaces indoors and outdoors. She knows how to plan the curriculum to build on what children know and can do. She knows the importance of gathering information from parents, other professionals and her own observations to make sure her plans meet what children need to learn next.
- The childminder has a good understanding of safeguarding and child protection. She knows how to act when there are concerns about the well-being and welfare of a child. She understands how to assess and manage risks to keep children safe.
- The childminder provides plenty of resources and equipment for children of different ages to use. These are in accessible boxes and on low-level shelving to encourage children to make choices about what and how they learn. The childminder will make use of the local farm shop, parks and walks to help children learn about the natural world and the community.
- The childminder has completed training to maintain her knowledge and skills. She knows the importance of reflecting on the quality of teaching she provides. She recognises the importance of using feedback from parents and children to help her make improvements.
- The childminder understands how to prepare children for their future and how to cope with changes. She builds good relationships with practitioners and teachers to plan visits for children before they move on. She knows how to provide children with activities that help them to learn about healthy food choices and how to care for themselves.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

She offers funded nursery education places for children aged two, three and four years.

The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
