#### Information about this secure children's home

This secure children's home is managed by a local authority. It is approved by the Department for Education to restrict children's liberty. The children's home can accommodate up to 10 children aged between 10 and 17 years. There were five children living at the home at the time of this monitoring visit.

The secure children's home provides accommodation for children placed by local authorities under section 25 of the Children Act 1989.

Admission of any child under section 25 of the Children Act 1989 who is under 13 years of age requires the approval of the Secretary of State.

The commissioning of health services in this home is the statutory responsibility of NHS England under the Health and Social Care Act 2012. Education is provided on site.

The manager was registered with Ofsted on 9 August 2022.

## This monitoring visit

This monitoring visit was carried out in line with the memorandum of understanding between Ofsted and the Department for Education (DfE).

Inspectors visited the home with specialist architects commissioned by the DfE. This visit forms part of the information that Ofsted provides to the DfE so that the Secretary of State can make a decision about the continuing suitability of the home to restrict children's liberty.

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Managers have ensured that the improvements needed to make the physical environment safe and secure are in progress and due to be completed in the near future.

■ The registered person should ensure that the incremental steps made by those children who have the greatest distance to travel are captured and celebrated to reflect the progress they are making in their social, personal and academic development.
