Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has addressed all the actions raised at the last inspection. For example, she has improved her knowledge of safeguarding procedures. The childminder describes how she will identify any possible risks to children and who she will report her concerns to, including the 'Prevent' duty. She demonstrates how she will make sure that the environment is safe and secure, and will carry out effective risk assessments to identify and reduce any hazards.
- The childminder describes how children learn. She can explain how her educational programme will reflect the individual needs of all children, including those children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. The childminder knows how to seek advice or make necessary referrals to other professionals with parents' consent. She explains how she will use observations and assessments to ensure that all children make progress in their learning.
- The childminder shows an understanding of how to support children who speak English as an additional language. She will provide opportunities for children to use their home language alongside English as they play. The childminder explains how this will support children's next steps in education.
- The childminder describes her high expectations for children's behaviour. She explains how she will teach children to treat each other kindly, listen and be respectful towards each other. The childminder describes how she will role model age-appropriate language and use kind words.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure knowledge of how to provide experiences to support children's emotional development. For example, she will work in partnership with parents to plan settling-in periods for young children before they start. She explains that this will support children's moves from home to the setting more smoothly.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear understanding of how to promote children's health. She explains how she will support children with daily opportunities. The childminder will use her well-laid out outdoor area, the local park and nearby woodlands to promote the development of children's small and large muscles.
- The childminder recognises the importance of keeping her professional development up to date. She continues to update her knowledge and skills with early years education courses to improve outcomes for children.
- Working in partnership with parents is important to the childminder. She describes how she will involve parents in their children's development and learning to ensure continuity of care. For example, the childminder explains that she will talk to parents about their children's signs of readiness for toilet training.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
