## **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder completes regular safeguarding training. She talks about the processes she would follow should she have concerns about children in her care. The childminder has a sufficient knowledge of the allegations process and knows how to make a referral. This helps to protect children from harm.
- The childminder demonstrates her understanding of how to provide an appropriate curriculum. She talks about how she provides a wide range of activities for children and how she promotes their learning. The childminder knows how to support children in becoming independent in readiness for starting school.
- The childminder knows the importance of promoting children's positive behaviour. She explained how she helps children to learn how to take turns and share popular resources to build their social skills.
- The childminder describes the importance of working closely with parents and other professionals involved with their children. This is done by sharing developmental information promptly, so that additional help can be sought without delay.
- The childminder continues to keep her knowledge up to date. She completes regular training and reads childcare publications. The childminder regularly reflects on her practice, which helps her to make improvements. For example, using nursery rhymes to help children's ongoing language and communication development. The childminder maintains a current paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder plans regular outings for children to explore the world around them and develop a range of physical skills.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
